ESA Foundation Honors Humanitarian Award Recipient

The ESA Foundation has a long history of recognizing outstanding individuals whose works serve not only the Foundation, but also the community at large. One such recognition is the Humanitarian Award. The Humanitarian Award recognizes the work of persons in communities through the United States and across the globe who are devoted to the welfare of humanity.

In April, the ESA Foundation Humanitarian Award was presented to Doug Goetsch of Gilbert, Arizona, by ESA Foundation Board Member Terrie Rust, at Arizona's State Council Meeting. The nomination came from Glenna Denton with the backing of her chapter, the members of Alpha Omicron #2520 of Scottsdale, Arizona. Doug resides in Copper Springs Resort Lifestyle Community, the community where Glenna also resides. Doug is an example of a truly selfless individual. As Glenna describes him, "Doug has a servant's heart".

During the presentation, Glenna shared several highlights of the numerous ways Doug has gone "above and beyond" to assist those living and working at Copper Springs. The letters of recommendation accompanying the nomination included more than time could allow for sharing.

Those highlights described Doug's providing resident transportation to/from doctor's visits, meetings, the airport, shopping trips, the casino (!), and transportation for workers to/from work, all at his own expense for gas. He frequently drives Glenna to and from ESA chapter meetings (and watches the calendar to remind her when those meetings are coming up!). He has assisted with (and often paid for) mechanical repairs, oil changes, tire rotations, etc. on residents' automobiles, even going so far as to take resident vehicles to the repair shop himself. He assists residents with wheelchair and power chair technical issues. One Community employee's nomination letter related how Doug built an e-bike for her husband. He also provided a portable A/C unit for their family (with 2 small children) when their apartment A/C went out during the summer and their landlord couldn't get it fixed right away.

Another notable nomination was from a resident who was hospitalized due to a broken hip. Doug visited her in the hospital to see if she needed anything, brought her flowers, and picked her up from the hospital when she was discharged. Additionally, he rounded up the special equipment she needed for her recuperation.

Doug lives the qualities that the Foundation looks for in Recognizing someone for the Humanitarian Award: a person who is devoted to the welfare of humanity, who aids those less fortunate, and who helps to eliminate the suffering and pain of others.

The ESA Foundation is proud to have been able to recognize Doug and honor him for his devoted and selfless service to the community.

ESA FOUNDATION CALL FOR NOMINATIONS BOARD OF DIRECTORS

In accordance with the ESA Foundation Bylaws, it is the duty of the Nominating Committee to nominate candidates for 3 Directors to fill vacancies on the Board of Directors for an ensuing three-year term. Nominations may be submitted to the Committee up until October 1, of each year. A nominee for Director must hold active membership in the ESA Foundation and be entitled to vote at the time the candidacy is put to a vote of the membership.

LIMITATIONS: No Director may serve more than two (2) consecutive 3-year terms unless filling a vacant director position; or hold an elective position on the Executive Board of the International Council of Epsilon Sigma Alpha, or be an employee of the ESA Membership Corporation, or hold an elective position on the Board of Directors of the Epsilon Sigma Alpha Membership Corporation during her/his term of office on the ESA Foundation Board of Directors.

BASIC FUNCTION: To actively participate in conducting the business of the Foundation by fulfilling the specific requirements of the Board of Directors; to give time and expertise in planning the future and growth of the ESA Foundation.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

1. Conduct the business of the Foundation in a professional manner.
2. Maintain the integrity of personal and Foundation activity.
3. Expand services and conduct projects within the framework of creditable business practices and viable parameters.
4. Attend all meetings, including IC convention as a candidate and multi-day meetings at midyear and IC Convention.
5. Carry out official and/or committee assignments in ways that meet functional requirements of the Foundation.

JOB QUALIFICATIONS:

1. Ability to travel to all Board Meetings, the Annual Meeting, and occasionally to IC Leadership or State meetings
2. Have a basic knowledge of the ESAF scholarship and grants program or similar programs with other organizations
3. Demonstrates leadership ability and willingness to work collaboratively with a diverse team
4. Have a working knowledge of word processing, spreadsheet software, electronic file shares (i.e. Dropbox, Google Drive, etc.) and web-based meeting software (i.e. Zoom, WebEx, GoTo Meeting, etc.)
5. Demonstrates timely follow through on commitments, open to new ideas, and a passion for the goals of the Foundation
